


Florida LSC Income Eligible Population


Population Experiencing Poverty Below 125% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines



Florida Congressional Districts with Urban and Rural Mix


Percent of County Population Living in Rural Areas

0 - 5% Rural >5 - 15% >15 - 35% >35 - 70% 70 - 100%



Political Party of Members of Congress








Floridians received help from Florida civil legal aid organizations with housing matters such as foreclosure, eviction, and access to affordable housing in 2015.








